Within the month of March our students took part in the following activities:

This month Welling school students have visited a number of places. Year 7 visited the Science museum. Giving students the opportunity to experience Science out of the classroom with interactive activities.

Year 10 Future Frontiers - Students were mentored by volunteers from industry, to get them thinking about their next steps on their career path.

CAREERS:

Welling School celebrated the Annual National Careers Week by holding a Lunchtime Careers Cafe, where year 9 students could have a one to one discussion with a year 11 student, to get a first hand idea of what it is like studying each of the GCSE subjects that we offer at KS4.

During the National Careers Week Year 12 and 13 students also had the opportunity of meeting university ambassadors from Canterbury, Greenwich and Goldsmith University to answer student questions ranging from the benefits of applying to university to what it's like living on a university campus.

London Ambulance Service came to present to the year 9, 10 and 12 students during National Careers Week, on the different careers available in their industry ranging from Control staff who handle emergency calls to Fleet staff who work in areas such as Information Management and Technology and Press & Communications. Students got the opportunity to ask questions at the end of the assembly and were amazed to learn that at peak times London Ambulance Service can answer up to 6,000 calls a day! The students were also delighted to hear about the apprenticeship routes that were offered by the London Ambulance Service.

Our year 12 and 13 students also received a presentation from the Visionpath organisation. This was an opportunity for our year 12 and 13 students to speak to a representative from VisionPath for an apprenticeship placement.

Our current head boy Ben Saywell took this opportunity last year and has just been offered an apprenticeship with BRITs Insurance apprenticeship programme with a great starting salary, starting in September.
