APD Welling Football Academy...

We are very excited to introduce our Welling Football Academy Programme to the Sixth form. We have partnered with APD (advance Player Development) who have trialled, recruited and organised a summer of pre season training for the team. The squad represent Welling School in the U18 Kent School's League and National Cup. APD support our players. Rather than a Football Academy run by a specific club, APD has the ability to help players be seen by a range of clubs. The aim is to prioritise the players needs and interests. Our Coach is Joe Tennent (UEFA Licensed). The squad trains 3x times a week, with Wednesday being match day. Each week the players benefit from individual and team match analysis. An international tour and show games against premiership clubs are being planned for later in the season. With two league games already played and won....This will be a very exciting season!





Year 11 ATL

Year 11 has started really positively, with students showing a great attitude to learning. This has been evident in our after school interventions, with 70% of the year group attending these interventions and it hasn't stopped there, as we have launched Saturday school interventions which are for targeted groups and again they have been well attended.

In preparation for our silver, gold and actually GCSE the English department has invited the Globe theatre company to come and perform live shows to our Year 11s and support them on their journey. The Year 11s were exceptionally well behaved and did a fantastic job of representing Welling school.

On Thursday 26th September we held a Year 11 preparation evening for GCSE. We had over 100 families attend the evening, sharing importation information for the year ahead.

Year 10 ATL

Year 10s have settled well into their first month as GCSE students. It has been lovely to speak and observe to a range of students enjoying their option subjects and how they feel more mature and focused now that they have transitioned to Key Stage 4.

Year 9 ATL

Our year 9s had a fabulous 3 day residential at the Marchants Hill PGL. They took part in many fabulous activities including rifle shooting, abseiling, bushcraft and climbing the very scary, 'Jacob's Ladder'! Our pupils were in great form and contributed positively, not only to the challenges - but to meal times and down time with staff. Year 8 ATL

As part of the school's personal development programme, which aims to support our students to develop the skills and knowledge necessary to prepare them for their next steps after school, students have volunteered to be student receptionists. The role requires students to assist the office, pastoral and teaching staff to support the rest of the school body by completing a variety of jobs.

Year 7 ATL

As part of the year 7 transition from primary to secondary school students attended a day kayaking and bell boating with their tutor groups. This trip was a great success with a 115 students taking part out of 135. This enabled students to experience something new outside of the classroom and forge friendships in a new environment.











Our Welling Mathematicians have made a flying start to the 2024/25 year. With record numbers signing up to study A-Level maths and our Year 11s already in full swing filling up extra intervention sessions. At Key Stage 3 we are integrating games from the esteemed Count On Us challenge. It seems Hedgehog has been a real favourite. See photo below. We can also confirm that adolescent minds are certainly quicker and more accurate at calculating to 24 than their teacher leaders.

In Science Year 7s have been exploring the topic of investigative skills and have been learning about different aspects of the scientific method such as forming a hypothesis, safely carrying out practicals and making accurate notes of their results. They have done practicals such as dissolving jelly, lighting a Bunsen burner and using microscopes.

Year 11 students have returned with renewed motivation and focus to do well in their exam and are now preparing for their Silver mocks. Our TKAT lead practitioner ran a session for 60+ students on exam techniques focusing on the required practicals.

The department is also celebrating a record number of students that have signed up for A level Biology and A level Chemistry.

In Drama Year 7 have been looking at the origins of theatre and theatre today, with tasks to go out and do some research into their local theatres. The quality of work has been very high - with short performances form 'Matilda' this week as their assessments. Year 8 have been studying 'Blood Brothers', and Year 9 have been looking at plays by Playwrights of the Global Majority. Tickets for trips to see 'Hamilton' and 'Dear England' have been booked in. We currently have the biggest Drama GCSE Year 10 class we have had in years - mostly boys, which is a plus - and the talent in the room is already very exciting. The panto - 'Jack and the Beanstalk' - has been cast with students from every year group taking part. Tickets will be on sale early next term.

This year has started off brilliantly within the music department. We've been quite busy hosting our "Music Scholar" club which seems to have the biggest number of students in attendance yet! The club which takes place during break and lunchtime daily has seen a wide range of students from rappers to pianists practising and perfecting their craft.

Our "Choir Club' has taken off with a range of members from year 7's to sixth form students attending; we have some big plans for the choir so please watch this space! With the sad departure of some of our year 11 students who have now started after school intervention, our "Band Club' has seen some new faces join our group, and some old faces taking on new roles in the band; things are getting quite exciting!





September has seen the launch of our Dance curriculum for Year 7, 8 and 9. All students have a weekly 1 hour session, before we expand further next year to offer GCSE Dance as an option.

Year 7 dancers have been exploring Fundamentals through the theme of super heroes, all students have shown incredible energy and commitment to this new subject. The students have commented that the dance classes have helped them to get to know their new classmates and to build new friendships.

Year 8 and Year 9 have been studying 'The Origins of Street Dance', exploring break dancing, commercial and voguing so far! A highlight has been the electric dance battles held by the Year 9 boys and the collaboration and teamwork in all classes, students have encouraged and motivated each other.

Olivier in Year 9 and Delight in Year 8 were the winners of the Golden Tickets in Dance, for showing so much determination and focus in class.

We have also launched our first ever dance company, Relevé who meet every Thursday after school, in the very first session we made a lyrical contemporary piece to show to the Year 6 families. The dancers were incredible and it is clear that a welcoming community of dancers is already forming here at Welling. The dance company runs every Thursday and everyone is welcome to join. We have kicked off our preparation for our school Panto, choreographing the open number, a very catchy song which we have been singing over and over again! In the next few weeks we will be planning some exciting theatre trips and professional workshops, so watch this space!

Knowledge Organisers at Welling School-Rationale

- KO is a one-stop shop for all the core knowledge for each topic
- Providing frequent opportunities to
- retrieve knowledge Making core knowledge accessible and readily available
- Aiding in long term memory and improving independent learning skills

How to use KO for homework

- For all Ebacc subjects KO for each term are glued/stuck in student books
- Once a week the teacher will set a homework task linked with the KO
- This should be recorded in student
- Students are required to complete this task at home using the KO

How to use KO in lessons

- All Ebacc subjects to encourage students to use their KO during knowledge retrieval tasks
- Encourage students to use their KO during deliberate practice
- Students should be guided to use the KOs for revision leading up to end of topic tests and other assessment

How to record student engagement with KO

- All KS3 teachers will be provided with a spreadsheet to log weekly homework task engagement
- Teachers should endeavour to reward students for completing KO linked homework on a weekly basis



What happens if students fail to complete the KO linked homework task

- 30 minutes detention in the first
- 60 minutes detention if homework not completed second time around
- Classroom teacher to contact home if their is persistently failure to complete

Knowledge Organisers (KO)

Knowledge organisers are no more than 2 sides of A4 that contain key facts and information that students need to have for a basic understanding of the topic. The main benefit is giving the student the 'bigger picture' of the topic. Research shows that our brain remembers things more efficiently when we can see the bigger picture and know how it is linked together, building our long term memory. The educational research supports that the knowledge organisers is a base and is used weekly to help students make the next step to providing more deeper, developed analysis.

In KS3, homework tasks have been created to be completed each week to ensure students are using the subject knowledge organiser.



Year 12s

Year 12 Business Students are currently exploring Crook Log Leisure Centre and the customer service provided by the Leisure Centre, as they embark on their first piece of coursework. They have made an impressive start with some students already submitting the first three tasks.

Year 10s have also been researching their favourite entrepreneurs and looking at the qualities they have which make them successful and admired.

In PSCHE Year 7 students have been focusing on settling in and focusing on who their support systems are throughout the school and how to manage transitions.

Year 8 - 10 and year 12 have been focusing on their health and wellbeing, including the importance of sleep, managing anger and healthy body images

Year 11 have been focusing on post 16 options and potential careers, including writing applications and goal settings and year 13 have been doing the same for post 18, focusing on apprenticeships, university and personal statements.

Year 11 have been working hard in revision for their upcoming silver mocks and NEA which will be starting soon!

6th form are settling in well and taking pride in their work. New exam/coursework units have begun and students are showing determination to start off the year well.

September saw large numbers of students opt to study Social Science subjects in Year 12, with an amazing 27 students taking Level 3 Criminology, and numbers nearly as high for A Level Psychology and A Level Sociology. It's great that these courses are proving so popular. We hope all our new social scientists enjoy their learning journey over the next couple of years!

Students had a series of assemblies delivered by Mr Hemsley on the importance of good attendance. Amongst other things, we explored the close link between attendance and exam results, and looked at why attendance below 90% is typically so destructive to students' chances of exam success. Students explored the other benefits of good attendance, including the important role that a regular daily routine plays in maintaining good mental health. Students were also reminded of the prizes up for grabs this year for those with excellent and/or vastly improved attendance.
