Life on the plantation was hard. Slaves worked all day with little food or rest. Slaves were beaten and sometimes killed.

AUCTIONS

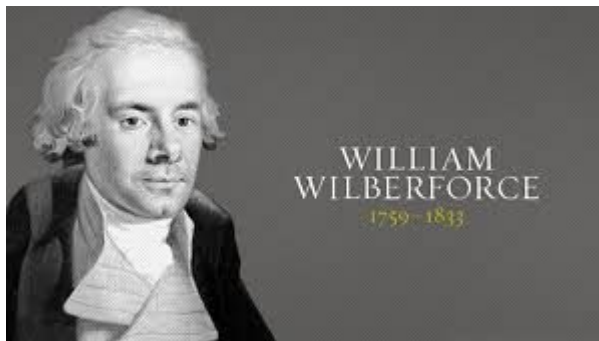
Slaves were sold when they reached the Americas.

Harriett Tubman

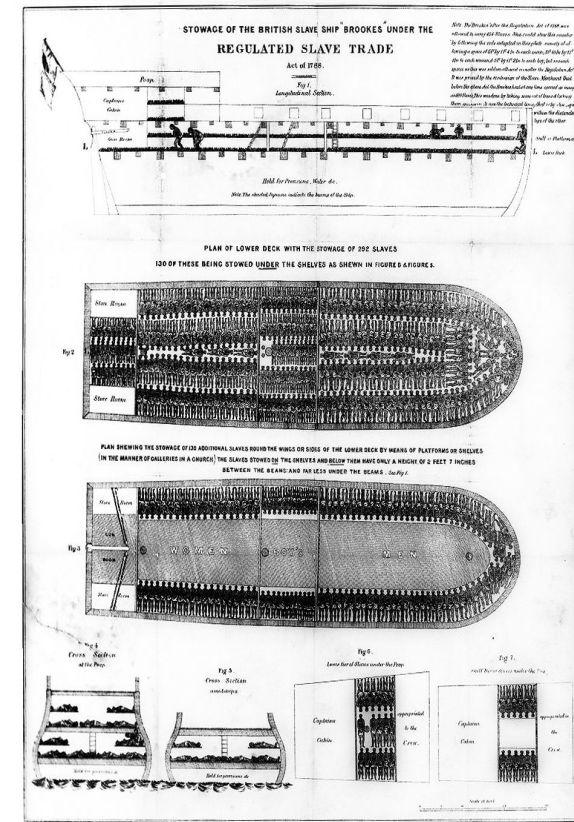


ABOLITION
